Edwin represents low-income children who are the most vulnerable in our state — victims of abuse and neglect, children with disabilities, and children who are new to our country. He is a skilled advocate who can get 'up to speed' quickly when need be. One example was with a 17-year-old who needed representation in Probate Court before he turned 18 in four weeks. Edwin jumped right in and immediately met with the boy and his aunt to get a full understanding of the case. He quickly filed the necessary paperwork to get an emergency hearing which resulted in a successful disposition in his client's favor.

- In current job, investigated and addressed the systemic failure to implement special education plans and identify students with disabilities by a Fairfield County school district.
