# **Educational Surrogate for Youth in DCF**

Appointed by Commissioner of Education in place of parent to advocate for educational needs and educational decision making for youth:

- Already in Special Ed
- Suspected of needing Special Ed or 504

Surrogate can continue until age 21 if client consents or child's graduation from high school, whichever is first.

CGSA 10-94g and 34 CFR 300.519



### **Education Consultants**

- Assigned to DCF Area Offices and Parole Services
- Provide consultation and training to staff
- Assist to assure each child in DCF care receives appropriate educational services





# **Educational Stability**

# Arguably the most important right for many children committed to DCF

- Children in out-of-home care have right to remain in school of origin
- Decision made by DCF
- Presumption that child will remain in school of origin
- Decision governed by BIOC
- 603

Conn. Gen. Stat. 17a-16a



### Raise the Grade: DCF and Education

- DCF must include description of educational status and academic progress in case plan of each child or youth
- Must include current levels of educational performance, absenteeism and supports/services provided to improve academic performance
- Educational status information must be included in reports to Juvenile Court and reviewed by the court when decisions are made regarding child's care.



# **Post Secondary Education**

DCF may offer funding for PSE to youth who:

- Are committed to DCF at 18<sup>th</sup> birthday
- Have obtained diploma or equivalent
- Demonstrate interest and ability to pursue accredited PSE program

Must be approved by DCF PSE consultant



# Dept. of Mental Health and Addiction Services Young Adult Services

### DHMAS YAS can provide

- clinical services
- case management
- residential services
- educational/employment services
- Youth must meet eligibility of mental health diagnosis
- DCF can continue to serve youth



# Department of Developmental Services

#### DSS services include

- residential services and in-home supports
- day services and employment supports
- family support, respite, case management
- transportation
- interpreter services
- clinical services





# **Department of Developmental Services**

### Eligibility for DSS services

- IQ of 69 or below
- significant limitations in adaptive functioning that began during before age 18
