

Champion of Children Award Winners Announced

Fran Rabinowitz, a former interim Bridgeport schools superintendent and now executive director of the Connecticut Association of Public School Superintendents, is among two recipients of this year's Champion of Children awards given by the Center for Children's Advocacy.

Also receiving the award is Abdul-Rahmaan I. Muhammad, executive director of My People Clinical Services.

Both will be honored on May 20, 2018 at the Center's annual Spring for Kids event at Infinity Hall, Hartford.

Rabinowitz has been a Connecticut educator for three decades. She has served as Connecticut's Associate Commissioner of Education and as Hamden's school superintendent.

Muhammad leads a community-based social service organization that helps Hartford-area youth and families rebuild their lives through therapeutic support and crisis intervention.
